English:	Write an informal letter as Jack to the giant. What could Jack say to the giant? Remember to include features of a letter e.g. address, date, greeting, main body and closing. Read the books and draw/write a storyboard explaining the main events or important information. Polite reminder to parents: It is very important to hear your child read for at least 10 mins a day. Record this in his or her reading diary which is monitored by the class teacher.

Record the tasks completed in your homework book.	Write down 5 things you do in a day and what time you do them. E.g. Wake up at 7 o'clock. Challenge: Re-write the times as digital time.	Create a price list for a fruit and vegetable shop, eg, carrots 8p each, potatoes 85p a bag. Write a shopping list and add up the total cost of your purchases. Work out your change from £2, £5 and £10.

Take a walk in your garden or local park with an adult. Identify a microhabitat (e.g. woodlice living under a log, stone or leaf litter). Draw and label a microhabitat or take a photo of a microhabitat you find.	Research into different habitats in the world (e.g. woodland habitat, ocean habitat and desert habitat). Select one habitat to create an information poster on. Include what animals and plants live there and why.
Art or DT	Look at some different animal prints (e.g. zebra stripes, cheetah spotted pattern and giraffe spots). Draw some animal patterns and label the pattern that animal has.	Create a habitat of your choice using reclaimed materials, e.g. an urban habitat, desert habitat or a woodland habitat. Remember to include the animals, plants and any other living things that live in that habitat.	Research paintings by famous artist George Stubbs. Notice that he painted animals. Create your own animal painting/drawing/sculpture. Remember to include animal prints.
