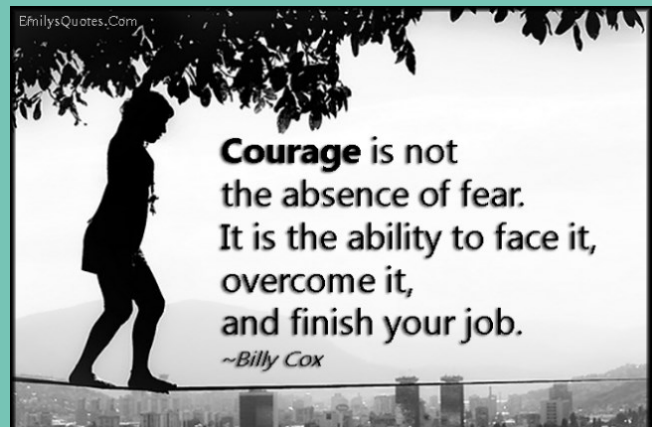

In assemblies this week, we discussed how over time, different “groups” have been subjected to hate and discrimination in society.....when my father moved to England in the late 1950s from Ireland, the dreadful sign below (left) was commonplace in the windows of Bed and Breakfast establishments. Nowadays, it’d be unusual for this group to be the subject of hate and it’d be far more likely nowadays for a Chinese person to be victimised (*the number of attacks on this group have worryingly risen since Corona-virus emerged—some members of the public believing each Chinese person is responsible for the formation of the virus?! Madness!*)

We focused on our school virtue of COURAGE and the importance of standing up against any injustice we witness. Standing by and “not telling” (and perhaps being grateful you are not the bully’s target) is understandable if in fear. However, we must try to be better than this! At Seva, we want our pupils to have the courage to stand up against the indefensible, even if that might mean being less popular, becoming the bully’s new target or being labelled a “snitch”. Seva students (hopefully) know all staff are there to support them and it is really important to do the RIGHT THING. That is why Seva students stand out of the crowd!!

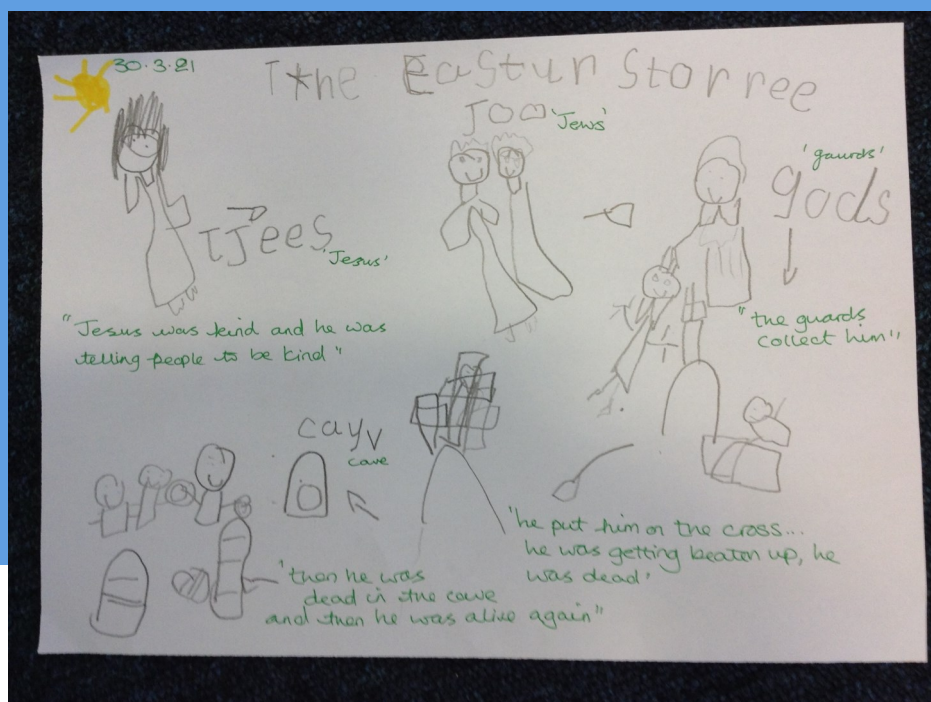
## Year 3A

## YEAR 6 ART

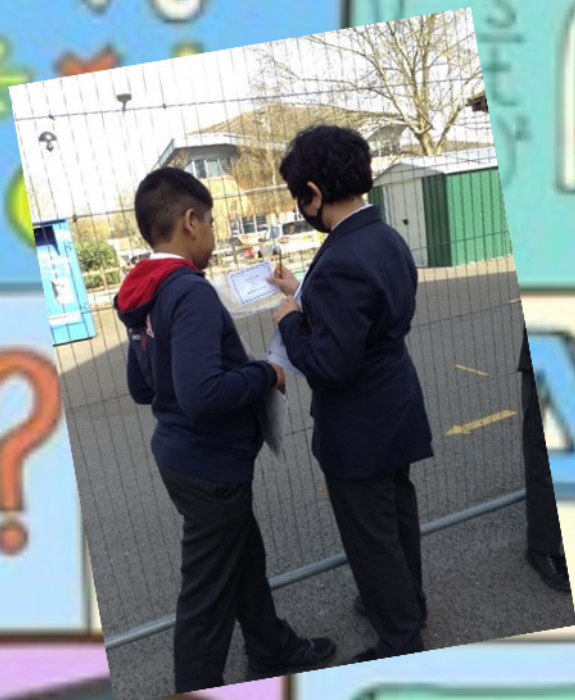
Year 6 have been busy spreading messages of hope, peace, equality and freedom through their graffiti art outdoors and on canvases.


### STEP 5B (MANUAL): BOOK APPOINTMENTS

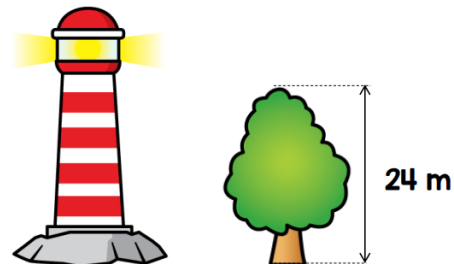

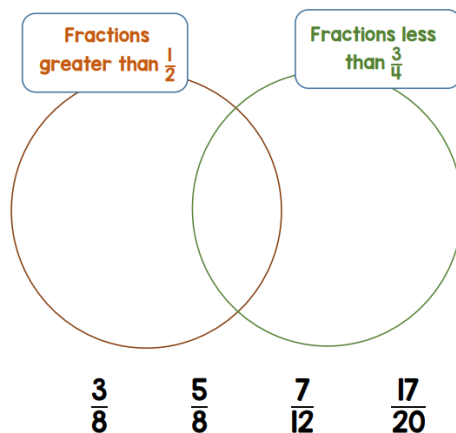

Year 11 had a virtual talk about apprenticeships by Ms Dean of Amazing Apprenticeships. She explained what apprenticeships are, the range of levels available and how they differ from other courses. One of the key ideas was that apprentices learn on the job and will complete qualifications determined by the employer. 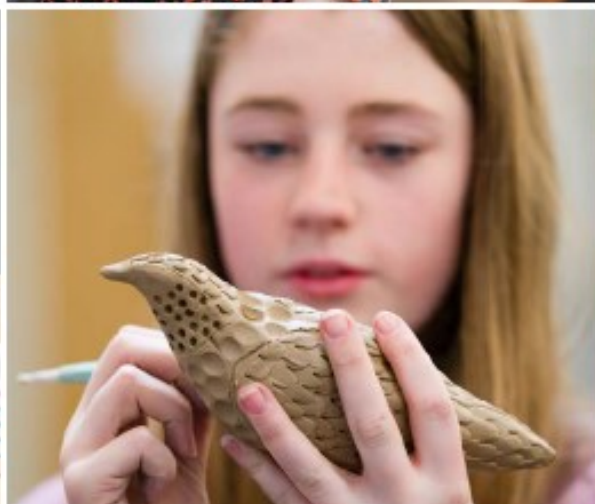
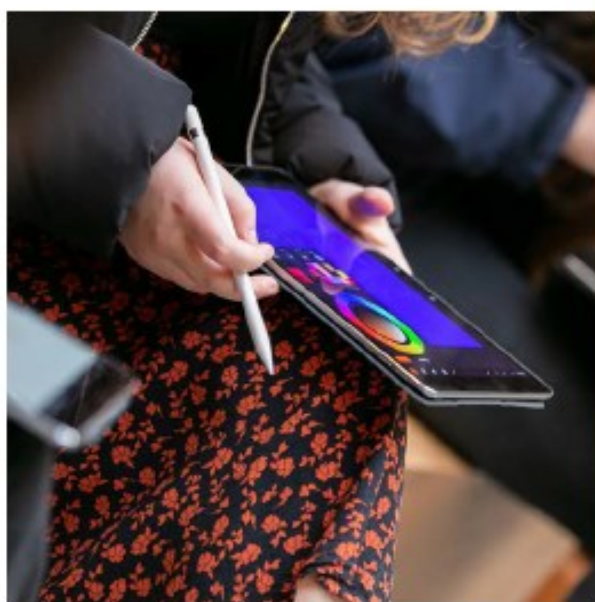

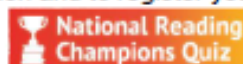
### National Reading Champions Quiz
